— AMAZING FRENCH ANIMATION: SEPTEMBER 1 - 7 —

French animation has a history dating back to the late 19th century, and we can thank the French for endless creativity and innovation ranging from the first use of a pinscreen apparatus to the first computer animated series produced in HD. This week we'll get our feet wet with the quirky caper "The Triplets of Belleville," the French-Iranian production "Persepolis," the steampunk adventure "April and the Extraordinary World," and the strikingly beautiful "The Girl Without Hands" based on a tale from the good ol' Brothers Grimm.



APRIL & THE EXTRAORDINARY WORLD (2015)

Set against the backdrop of 1941 Paris, a teen and her talking cat embark on a quest to find her missing parents.



PERSEPOLIS (2007)

Based on Marjane Satrapi's graphic novel, a young girl comes of age during the Iranian Revolution.



THE GIRL WITHOUT HANDS (2016)

A miller sells his daughter to the Devil and, while her purity protects her life, the Devil takes her hands as punishment.



THE TRIPLETS OF BELLEVILLE (2005)

Three vaudeville veterans help a woman rescue her grandson from a brutal underground cycling ring.

— SUPERHEROS: SEPTEMBER 8 - 14 —

How do you prefer your superheroes? Humble beginnings or destined for greatness from the start? Vigilante or faithful public servant? Tights or fangs? While this week's lineup is a small selection from the wide world of heroes and heroines, it has a few of the classics we love to see on screen: "Batman Returns," "Batman Returns," "Wonder Woman" (finally!), and "Blade."



BATMAN RETURNS (1992)

Batman contends with the nefarious plans of The Penguin, and the seductive attentions of Catwoman.



BLADE (1998)

A half-human, half-vampire makes it his mission to protect the mortal race and rid the earth of vampires.



SUPERMAN (1978)

Superman battles the villainous Lex Luthor while, disguised as novice reporter Clark Kent, he attempts to woo co-worker Lois Lane.



WONDER WOMAN (2017)

The origin story of Diana, princess of the Amazons, and how she became the protector of mankind known as "Wonder Woman."

— ESSENTIAL AMERICAN CINEMA: THE 1980'S: SEPTEMBER 15 - 21 —

Row House continues its Essential American Cinema series featuring the 1980's in all of its cash-flush, consumer driven, big budget glory. The 80's introduced the PG-13 rating, and the return of studio-driven movie concepts briefly suppressing art house films. Heavy hitting directors Martin Scorsese ("Raging Bull"), and Woody Allen ("Crimes & Misdemeanors") managed to survive the transition and even thrived. Most notable is Spike Lee ("Do The Right Thing") whose career took off.



CRIMES & MISDEMEANORS (1989)

Both dramatic and humorous storylines contemplate the question "can a man live with himself after committing murder?"



DO THE RIGHT THING (1989)

On the hottest day of the year, racial tensions come to a head at a pizzeria in Brooklyn.



RAGING BULL (1980)

A biopic of boxer Jake LaMotta chronicling his self-destructive nature both in and outside of the ring.



KOYAANISQATSI (1982)

A collection of expertly photographed phenomena with no conventional plot. The footage focuses on nature, humanity and the relationship between them.

— JAILBREAK: SEPTEMBER 22 - 28 —

Don't deny it. You've thought about how you'd break out of jail should the occasion arise. Thanks to the magic of cinema there are plenty of movies providing creative fodder; there are spoons, maps, secret meetings, alliances, guards bought-off, and the list goes on. This week Jean Renoir's escape film "La Grande Illusion" features a WWI POW camp. Another French film "Le Trou" is based on real events, features mostly non-actors, and one of the men involved in the 1947 jailbreak. Clint Eastwood goes up against the infamous American island prison in "Escape from Alcatraz." Finally, it's Cooney, cons, & capers in the Coen classic "O Brother, Where Art Thou?"



ESCAPE FROM ALCATRAZ (1979)

Frank Morris has never met a prison he can't escape, and the infamous Alcatraz is next on his list.



LA GRANDE ILLUSION (1937)

French soldiers held in a WWI prison camp grapple with class divides while trying to escape their German captors.



LE TROU (1960)

Four's company but five's a crowd when an unexpected new cellmate joins an elaborate jailbreak.



O BROTHER, WHERE ART THOU? (2000)

Three escaped convicts search for treasure in the deep south during the 1930's.
